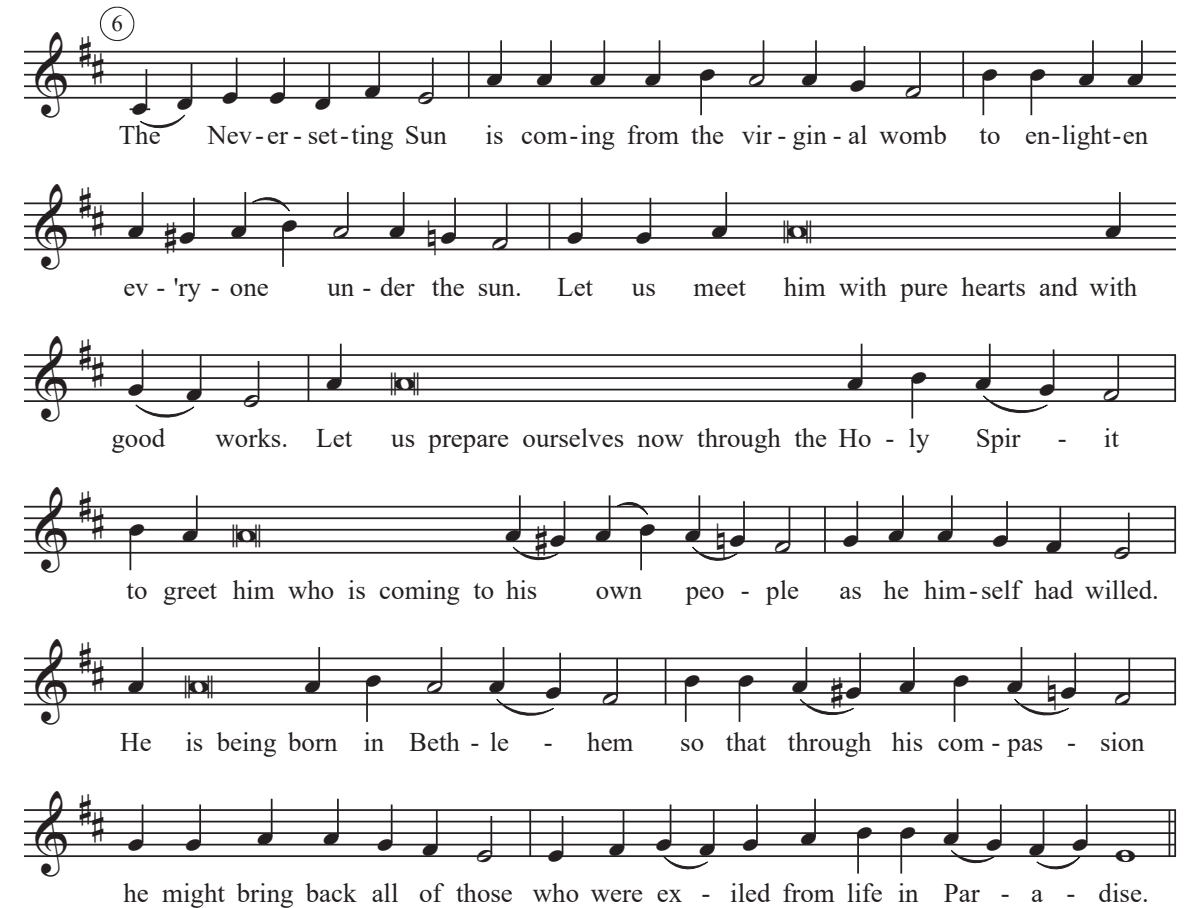

(on 5) My soul is longing for the Lord more than watchman for daybreak.

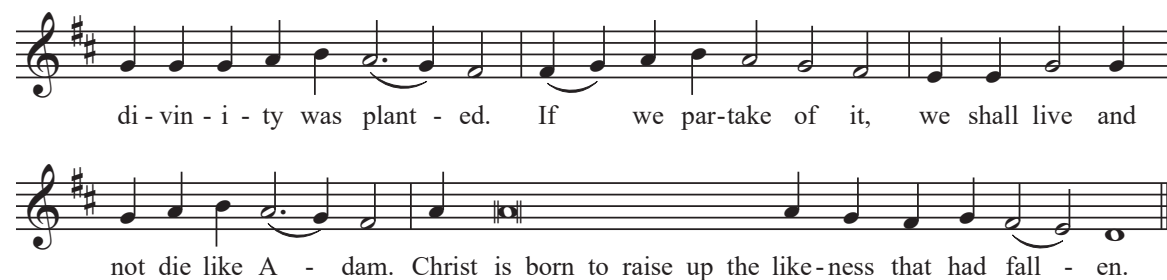

of the ser-pent. You come to be wrapped in swad-dling clothes



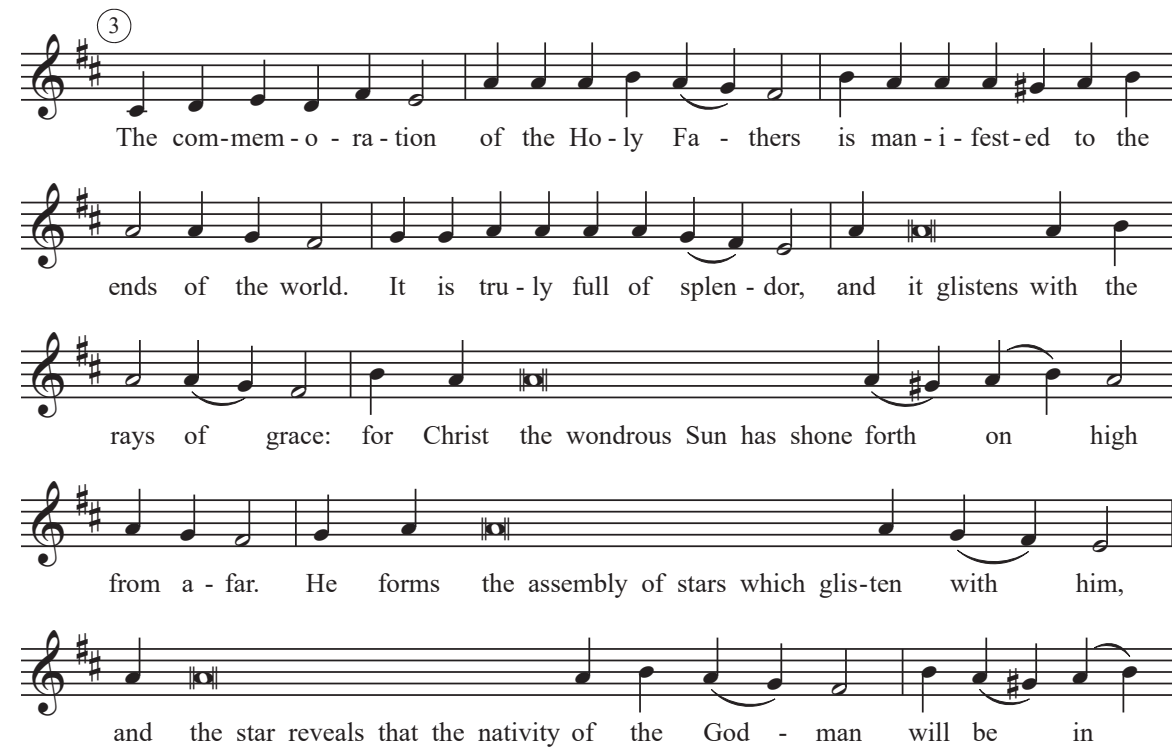

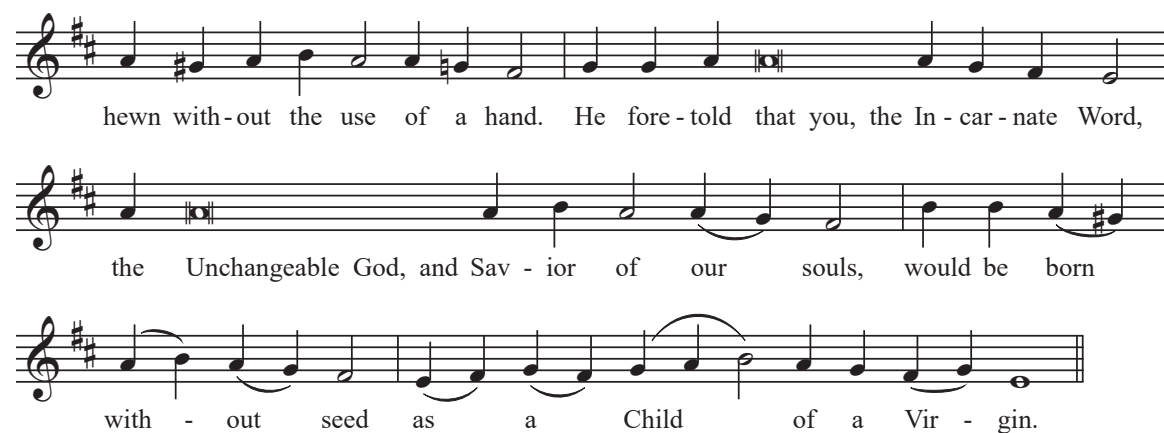

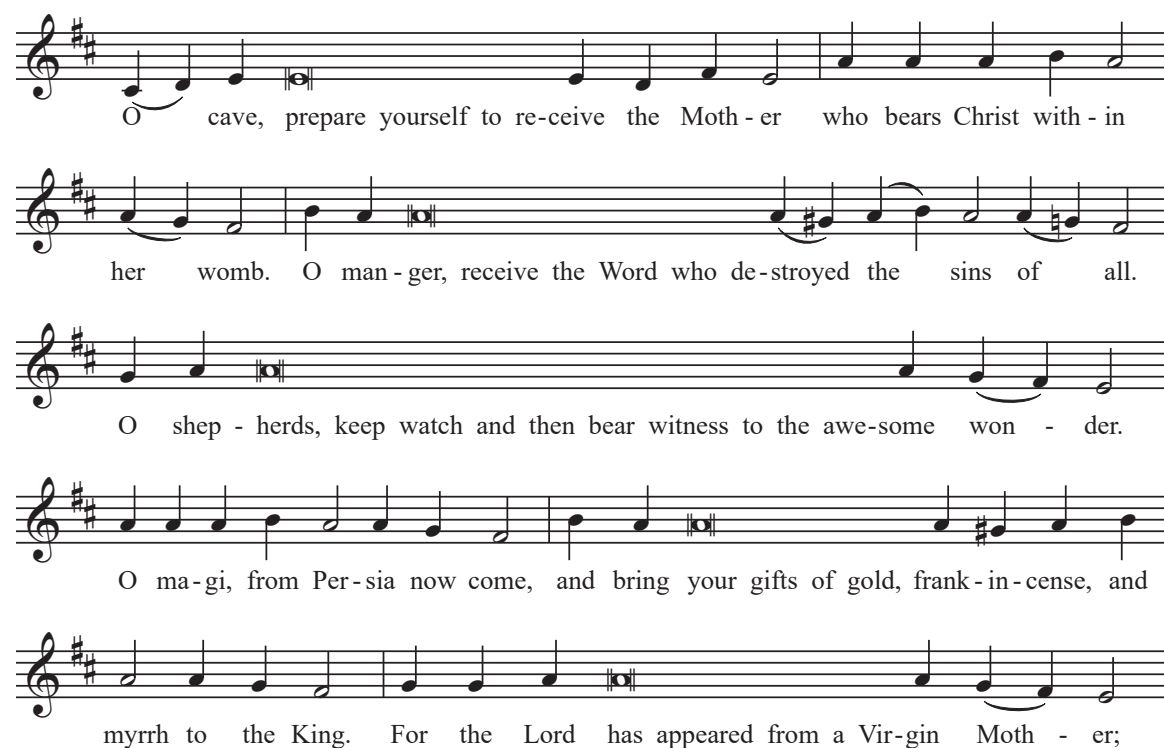
Dan - iel was a be - lov - ed man. He saw you, O Lord, as the Rock which was



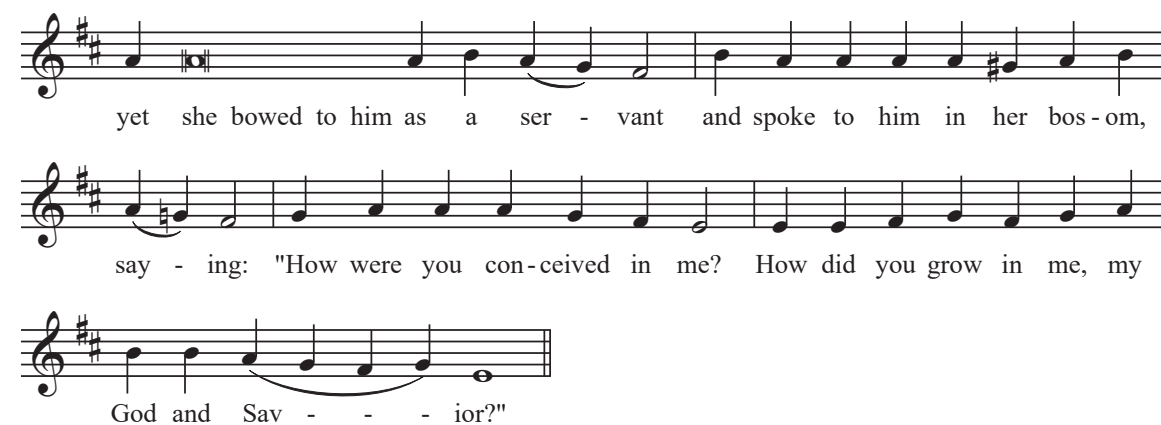
hewn with-out the use of a hand. He fore-told that you, the In-car-nate Word,

God and Sav- - - ior?"

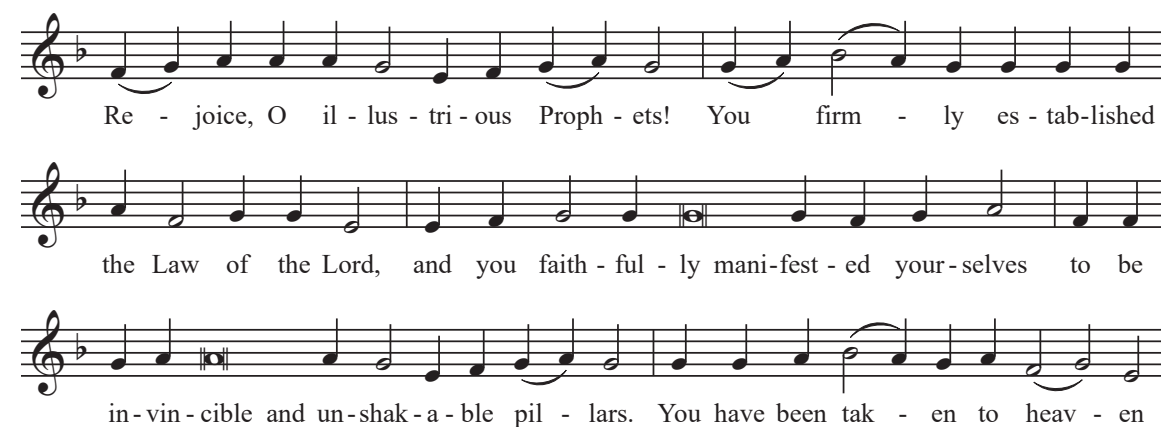
